

## **Personal, Social, Health & Economic Education, Citizenship and SMSC**

PSHE education is a school subject through which pupils develop the knowledge, skills and attributes they need to keep themselves healthy and safe, and prepare for life and work in modern Britain. Evidence shows that well-delivered PSHE programmes have an impact on both academic and non-academic outcomes for pupils, particularly the most vulnerable and disadvantaged. (PSHE Association)

In Ninestiles, our Programme of Study for PSHE education aims to develop skills and attributes such as resilience, self-esteem, risk-management, teamworking and critical thinking in the context of learning through a programme called Aspire. Lessons are grouped into three core themes: health and wellbeing, relationships and living in the wider world. This includes economic wellbeing and work related learning. Our relationship and sex education is taught during this time in accordance with the Ninestiles SRE policy.

Our school mission statement contains the phrase:

(Ninestiles School) 'will be structured and resourced to meet the needs of 21st century students. Within a caring environment we will develop and reinforce the values, skills and attributes which promote good citizens and lifelong learning.'

We also have an obligation through the Education Reform Act 1988 which states:

'The curriculum for a maintained school (must be) a balanced and broadly based curriculum which — (a) promotes the spiritual, moral, cultural, mental and physical development of pupils at the school and of society; and (b) prepares such pupils for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of adult life.'

In addition to the PSHE described above we aim to cover SMSC (Spiritual, moral, social and cultural education), British Values, and citizenship education through a combined programme of Aspire, daily assemblies and tutor activities.

The programme for Aspire and sample assembly themes are attached.

In common with a growing number of schools nationally and locally, we have committed to building a sustainable 'rights respecting environment'. The school has been recognised by UNICEF as effectively promoting the values and principles of the 'United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child' and that we are using this to underpin our vision for school development. We have received the UNICEF Recognition of Achievement and are working towards the Level 1 award.

By combining these elements it will be evident that education of the whole child is of paramount importance to us and that the Ninestiles curriculum in its broadest sense is designed to prepare our students be the very best they can be as local, national and global citizens of the future.
